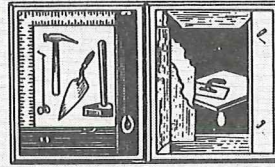

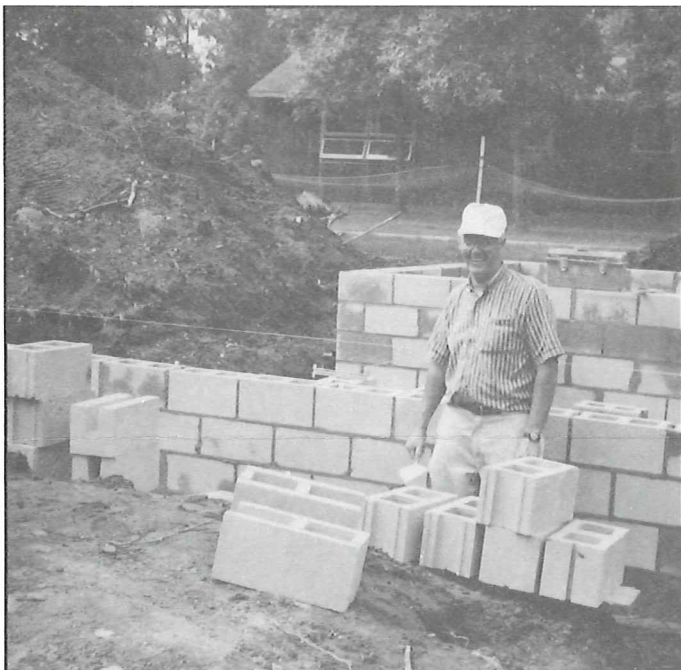

If you're considering retiring please contact the Union Office three months in advance to fill out the necessary papers.

TWIN CITY BRICKLAYERS PENSION FUND!!!

Effective January 1, 1995, retirees and beneficiaries on the rolls as of December 31, 1994, will receive a 5 percent increase in their monthly pension amount.

For participants retiring on or after January 1, 1995, who earn 1/10 of a pension credit on or after May of 1994, for which contributions were required to be received by the Fund, and a minimum of 1,600 hours of contributions during the 60 month period immediately prior to retirement, the accrual rate is increased to \$89.25 for pension credits earned after January 1, 1988.
